Mental Health on Campus: What we need to know

1 in 3 university students report feeling "overwhelmed" a great deal of the time.
1 in 7 students show significant depressive symptoms
1 in 12 qualify as having major depression
Depression is #1 reason

1/10 attempt suicide who had thoughts of suicide
.012 complete suicide

3 keys words:

A person feeling suicidal is feeling pain that is to them:

interminable
inescapable
intolerable

Suicide prevention as a responsibility for everyone
Education of members of the community ("what you might see, what you might say")

Threat Assessment team - Recognition of the merit of Prevention and Early
Identification along with Intervention (Response) and Postvention.
