A bit about our Speakers ...

Dr. Alan Avidan, Ph.D., M.B.A., Dr. Alan Avidan is an expert in alerting and Mass Notification Systems (MNS) and related technologies. In 1993, Dr. Avidan co-founded MadahCom, Inc., a recognized technological and innovative leader in emergency control and mass notification solutions for both commercial and military applications. In 2007, Cooper Industries acquired MadahCom, which now forms the core of the Cooper Notification Division.

Recognizing the lack of adequate alerting technologies, Dr. Avidan helped develop a modern vision and discipline for public alerting. With his guidance, MadahCom developed and implemented WAVES[®] (Wireless Audio Visual Emergency System), an entirely new digital wireless platform optimized for robust and survivable real-time alerting.

Dr. Avidan has been a speaker at major conferences and events, both commercial and military, including ISC, NFPA, NSCA, and US Pacific Command Anti-Terrorism Force Protection. Dr. Avidan holds a PhD degree in Engineering and an MBA.

William Blair, was appointed Chief of the Toronto Police Service on April 26, 2005. Chief Blair started his 30 year policing career as a beat officer in downtown Toronto, and continued with assignments in drug enforcement, organized crime units, and major criminal investigations. Promoted to the Senior Ranks of the Service, his postings included Divisional Commander, Community Policing Programs, and Detective Operations, responsible for all specialized investigative units including the Homicide Squad, Hold up Squad, Sex Crimes Unit, Fraud Squad, Forensic Identifications Services, Intelligence Services, and Organized Crime Enforcement, including the Guns and Gangs Unit, and the Repeat Offender Program.

As Toronto's Chief of Police, he oversaw the development of the Toronto Anti-Violence Intervention Strategy (TAVIS) to combat violent crime. Rapid response teams are deployed to at-risk neighbourhoods to enhance enforcement and support local policing initiatives while promoting the role of Community Response Units and the 'neighbourhood police officer'.

Chief Blair holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Toronto with dual disciplines of Economics and Criminology (1981) and a Certificate in Law Enforcement Administration from the University of Toronto (1983). He is a graduate of the Federal Bureau of Investigation National Academy (1990) and the Police Leadership Program from the University of Toronto, Rodman School of Business Management (2002) and National Executive Institute (2006).

J. Kevin Cameron, M.Sc., R.S.W., is a diplomat with the American Academy of Experts in Traumatic Stress and a Board Certified Expert in Traumatic Stress. In concert with the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, Behavioural Sciences Unit, he developed Canada's first comprehensive, multidisciplinary threat assessment training program and currently serves on the Canadian Threat Assessment Training Board. He also trains crisis response teams nationally and internationally and consults with schools and communities impacted by trauma.

He has years of clinical experience, including working in the Child Welfare and Young Offender systems in Canada, providing high-risk assessment and intervention with children, youth and families. He is also Adjunct Faculty with Loma Linda University (Canadian Campus) where he teaches "Crisis Intervention Counseling" in the graduate program.

Ann Marie E. Gallagher Guilmette, BPHE, MPE, Ph.D. (Psychology). Ann Marie is an associate professor at Brock University in Recreation and Leisure Studies. In addition to having received several research grants, she has several peer reviewed publications to her credit as well as several awards and distinctions. One of her six professional affiliations or administrative appointments is to the International Society for Humor

Studies (ISHS). At Brock University, Ann Marie is responsible for six courses of study with one of them being the Therapeutic Benefits of Humour. Ann Marie is a much sought after presenter for conferences and large gatherings at Brock University, her light hearted presentations entertain and inform at the same time.
